The university's annual homecoming CANapalooza benefits the Greater Baton Rouge Food Bank. Before their donation, the cans are used to create a replica of Tiger Stadium. In 2011, over 13 tons of cans were collected, with Greek Life accounting for 26,000 of those cans.

Homecoming week follows the theme of "Show Your Stripes: Celebrating Traditions and Leaving Legacies," and Greek Life does so with the traditional pairing of fraternities and sororities to compete in the annual flag football tournament and lawn decoration competition.

All LSU students can compete in Wednesday's coed flag football tournament, hosted by the Greek Board of Directors at 6 p.m. at the UREC Student Recreation Center (SRC) Field Complex.

Wrapping up the week's events is the lawn decorating contest, where sorority row is decorated with large pomp structures that showcase each sorority and fraternity pair's interpretations of the homecoming theme. All structures will be on the front lawns of the sorority houses, and judging begins at 7 a.m. with results announced at 9 a.m.
